Failsworth School

Ofsted May 16

I am delighted to inform the Trust partners that Failsworth School has successfully removed Special Measures after a recent Ofsted visit on 24th/25th May 2016. The Ofsted team have graded the school as Requiring Improvement and they have graded Leadership and Management as good. This is a testimony to the hard work and joined up thinking between the Interim Executive Board (IEB), the Local Authority who have provided additional support, the Interim Executive Headteacher Neil Hutchinson and the Head of School, Phill Quirk. The Ofsted team have recognised that "Much of teaching is now good" and "The leadership team, with strong support from the Interim Executive Board (IEB) and the Local Authority, have embedded a clear vision and ambition for the future of Failsworth School."

Ofsted continued by saying "Pupils behave appropriately around the building, where they are unfailingly polite and respectful" and "Pupils who met with inspectors were of the view that in many classes work was now harder, questioning more challenging and the marking and feedback they received more helpful."

Although we are very pleased with Ofsted's judgement we are not complacent as we are fully aware of the journey ahead. This

was recognised by Ofsted who acknowledged that "leaders and managers are fully aware of strengths and weakness in the school and have put appropriate and effective plans in place to secure rapid improvements in teaching and learning."

Finally, I would like to thank you for your ongoing support and it was pleasing to see that Ofsted recognised "The school is popular with the local community. It is oversubscribed and the great majority of parents and carers who completed a school parental survey were supportive of the school and its leadership."

Leadership of the School going forward

From 1st July 2016 Phill Quirk will be taking over as Acting Headteacher and he has been asked by the IEB to continue the recent strong work of all partners in securing rapid improvement. Phill joined the school 13 years ago as Deputy Headteacher and more recently he has been Head of School. In addition, Neil Hutchinson will continue to work with the school for 1 day per week in an Executive Headteacher role.

We believe the future is bright for Failsworth School and we will continue to improve quickly in order to secure at least a Good Ofsted judgement.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all staff, students, parents and partners of the school for their continued support of the school.



Year 7 and 8 Trip to MOSI

During Summer Term 2, 11 of our students from years 7 and 8 attended a Science Technology Engineering and Maths (STEM) careers event at the Museum of Science and Industry where they met both local and national employers; NHS, Laing O'Rourke, Royal Society of Chemistry, RAF, Siemens, Ferodo, AECOM, Sharp Future, FP Diesel, UK Fast and BAE systems. The students learned about job and apprenticeship opportunities and were able to get involved.

Declan Schofield (Year 7) was given a business card and invited to go along to a computer programming club at Sharp Future (in Newton Heath). He was totally in his element telling the employers about his YouTube channel and his website that he set up himself!

Matthew Quinn and Dylan Savage (Year 8) both tried their hand at changing brake pads. Sophie Lang and Alana Hardman (Year 8) enjoyed using the Oculus technology brought in by Laing O'Rourke to simulate using the controls on a crane. James Hall was engrossed in the missile and flight simulator brought in by the RAF and Callum Tomlinson (Year 7) was a brilliant trip leader/tour guide navigating Mr Lowe and myself around the museum!

The students were amazing all day. They communicated not only

with employers but with pupils from other schools. Our Year 7's were a little apprehensive about being the youngest but it was lovely to see how quickly they all became a group and the Year 8's really took them under their wing. They were a credit to the school and staff.
